The Wisconsin Bound Dog Rescue will also be there, providing information about their rescue group and other ways to help. So when considering gifts for Father's Day, upcoming birthdays, graduations, or any other occasion, give a book, and increase the support for dog rescues.

The Wisconsin Bound Dog Rescue (WBDR) has hundreds of rescue stories. They shared these two with me. The first is a Wisconsin rescue of a smaller pug (~20 lbs.) who was impregnated by the owner's larger "bully" type dog (~70 lbs.). The owner told a co-worker that he expected to find his pug dead when he went home that night. She had been in labor for 48 hours with no results, and he wasn't willing to spend the money for a vet. His co-worker fosters dogs for WBDR and contacted them immediately. Within twenty minutes, WBDR had the pug at the vet's after obtaining the dog's surrender. The vet did an emergency C-section. The mother and all seven puppies survived, and have been adopted out to good homes. The vet told them that if the dog had been brought in an hour later, she would not have survived.

The second story involves the rescue of a pregnant dog from Alabama (many of the southern states lack shelters) who was about to be put down as well as about to have puppies. Someone found out about the situation, did a quick temporary rescue of the dog, and called WBDR. WBDR coordinated an emergency trip to meet the other rescuer in Missouri and now has the dog and her five puppies in foster care until they are ready for adoption.

Spaying and neutering plays an important role in reducing the number of strays needing rescue. Here's a way to donate money to help without having to spend an extra cent. All profits from the sales of [Robin Kould and Mary Yen Rescue series](#) are donated to dog rescue groups and shelters. Let your friends and dog rescue supporters know that they can help dog rescue efforts by gifting any or all of the Robin Kould And Mary Yen Rescue books to their "tweenage" relatives and acquaintances. Use the books for middle school Rescue Reader Programs where students read to dogs in shelters and rescue programs. Suggest the books to middle school teachers as a foundation for classroom projects that could help acquire needed items from wish lists. Help improve the reading skills of these students while increasing support for dog rescues.

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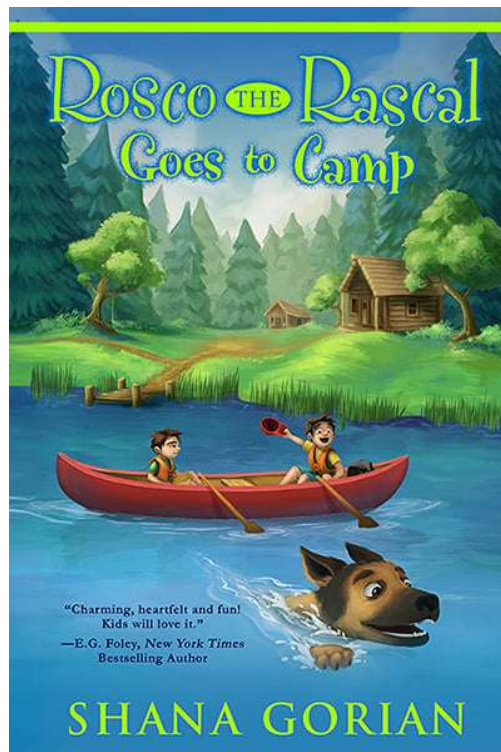

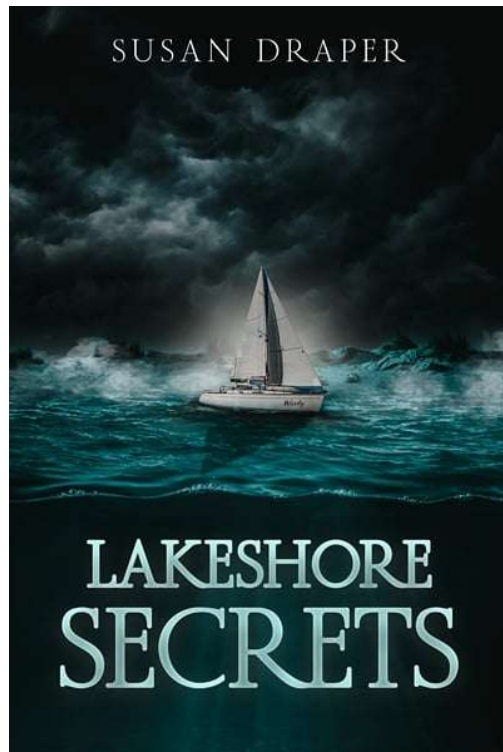

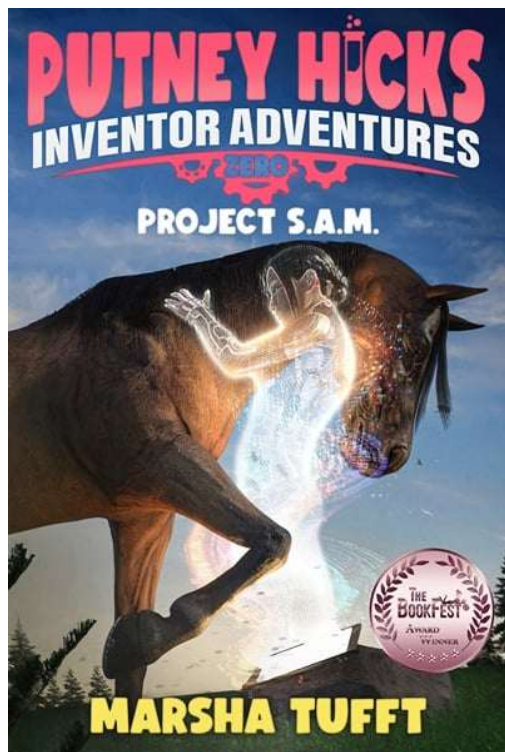
