A wonderful rescue story e-mailed to me.

My husband and I came home one day after grocery shopping and there was a LARGE Rottweiler laying in front of our garage door. He acted as though he had been waiting for our arrival for quite some time. Neither of us had ever seen him before, and he slowly got up. I approached him very carefully, although he didn't look vicious. I figured it could have been our neighbor Judy's dog, since we knew she owned a Rottweiler. But there were telltale signs that it may not be Judy's dog. First of all, it had a frayed rope attached to a horrible looking choke type collar. Something Judy would never put on one of her dogs. Second, it was dirty. Obviously hadn't had a bath in a very long time. And finally, I noticed dried, caked blood around its neck. Upon inspection, I saw that its collar was way too small and had grown into its neck. WOW! He was a MESS!

I called Judy and sure enough, it wasn't her dog, but she said she'd be right over. We nicknamed him "Bubba," a common nickname in the South. We both determined that the dog not only needed rescuing, but mostly likely needed a hefty vet bill to boot! Now Judy pulls a lot of weight here in town, as her husband is a very well known, perhaps even infamous, attorney. Since she has several dogs, she had a pretty good relationship with the local vet, Clay Reynolds. She had him on speed dial, and called him right up! She explained the situation and then asked what he could do for us. He said he would come over and pick him up, would do the surgery needed, keep him at his office for a week, and only charge what he spent out of pocket. What a deal! He drove right over, took a look and just shook his head. There was a lot of infection and the flesh had putrefied. So Clay picked him up in his arms - a heavy dog mind you - and after placing him in the back of his pickup, gave him an injection that made him woozy, then asleep. At that point, our only concern became what to do with him when we picked him up. Judy and I agreed to split the cost of whatever Clay charged and went back to what we were doing when all this began.

Bubba stayed with the vet 10 days, and during that time I spoke with Judy about finding a home for him. She said she knew some people in Alex City who might want him, and I encouraged her to look into it as we were pretty new to the area and didn't

know of anyone who might want to adopt him. When I went into the vet's office to pay, the entire bill was only \$150, so I wrote a check for the entire amount, and told Judy she needed to go pick him up, because our mini-dachschund would be very upset if we tried to bring him into our house. She agreed. Thankfully, the couple she knew gladly took Bubba and from what I hear, he lived happily ever after, rescued from an abusive home, patched up by a wonderful, kind-hearted vet, and truly loved and appreciated by his new owners.
